Holy Dormition Chapel hosting picnic

Located on Chicago Trail outside of New Carlisle, the Holy Dormition Chapel of St. Andrew Greek Orthodox Church has been a part of the community for nearly 60 years. The connection between New Carlisle and St. Andrew's, located in South Bend, was established long ago as many of the parishioners lived in the area.

In 1956 Louis Nitsos, a wealthy farmer, gave five acres of his farmland to the Parish to build a chapel in memory of his parents. The chapel was used infrequently, except on the Feast Day of the Holy Dormition.

After a Divine Liturgy at St. Andrew in South Bend, parishio-

ners would drive out to the chapel on Chicago Trail to have a Greek style picnic. At that time, St. Andrew's was located on Michigan Street in downtown South Bend with limited land to host large events.

Out in the vast farmland, the chapel provided a venue for the parish picnic until the Church moved to its more spacious current location on Ironwood Road. (St. Andrew's annually hosts a three-day Greek Fest in June, drawing up to 5,000 guests to celebrate Greek culture and food.) As a result, the chapel fell into years of disuse.

However, when Father George Konstantopoulos came to South Bend in 2000, he noticed the neglected chapel had potential and sought to reactivate and renovate the building for weekly use.

Father George credits the grace of God and generosity of the parishioners for the revival of the chapel. Originally with only room to hold 20 people, the building has been expanded to hold up to 85.

While the chapel has been revived, there are still plans to improve the facility in the near future. There is work to be done outside, including landscaping and paving. A decorative wall to enclose the property and a bell tower are also desired.

The chapel will be hosting its 13th annual Holy Dormition Feast Day Parish Picnic on Sun-

Let us salute the XXXI Summer Olympiad from Rio de Janeiro with the versatility of global toppings for the All American hot dog in commemoration of our USA Summer Olympians.

After grilling your hot dogs, use the following toppings to make your hot dog on the bun to stay in theme with this year's Summer Olympics.

ALL AMERICAN

Spoon on warm chili, finely shredded sharp cheddar and canned crispy fried onions. Or, top with barbecue sauce, pulled pork and cole-

slaw.

GERMAN

Top with German mustard, sauerkraut and pretzels.

KOREAN

Combine 1/2 cup of water, 1/2 cup of white wine vinegar, 1/4 cup of sugar and 1/2 tsp salt. Bring to a boil. Remove from the heat and cool. Pour over 1 English cucumber and refrigerate at least 2 hours. Scatter cucumbers on the hot dog and finish with sriracha.

CAPRESE

Layer sliced Roma tomatoes and fresh mozzarella along the inside of a hot dog bun. Garnish with chopped fresh basil.

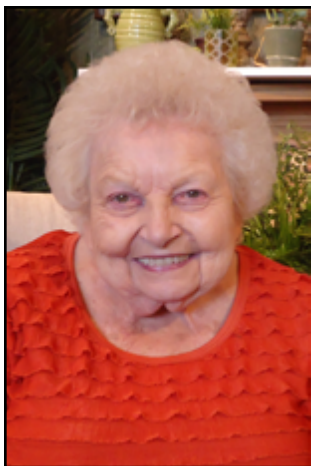

CARIBBEAN

Wrap one sliced smoke bacon around each hot dog. Broil 8 minutes, turning once, until cooked and crisp. Top with chopped cherry tomatoes and romaine, finish with mayo.

Top with peanut sauce, finely chopped carrots and cilantro.

Downtown New Carlisle full of historic charm

Part of New Carlisle's charm is certainly because many of its businesses have maintained their beautiful historic buildings and are alive with special offerings in so many ways. Along with the expansion of many new homes over the years, the community also features a number of extraordinary houses still intact from the 1800's and early 1900's.

The current New Carlisle Town Hall building in downtown once housed the New Carlisle Olive Township Public Library built in 1921 with funds appropriated by the Carnegie Corporation.

To this day, I am sure many long-time residents remember the joy of spending time in the former library. Long before our now common electronics, local kids spent

many hours enjoying the stories read by Librarian Kitty Wade and choosing books to take home to read. For 40 years, Mrs. Wade considered all children who came as her own, helping them find just the right books for their age and interest.

When the Library moved its quarters to a new and beautiful building on Bray Street in 2002, the old building downtown was reconstructed into an outstanding new town hall. As in the former building, our exceptional NCPD staff share the Town Hall space.

It's fun to also remember that our beautiful Memorial Park, located in the middle of the town, was once the exact spot where the former New Carlisle High School and Elementary School were once located.

New Prairie High School, New Prairie Middle School, and Olive Elementary School were built to replace that facility.

He was a member of the Alex Coquillard Chapter Sons of the American Revolution and the South Bend Area Genealogical Society. He had been active in organizing "Hometown Days" in New Carlisle.

New Carlisle Longshots compete in BPA World Series

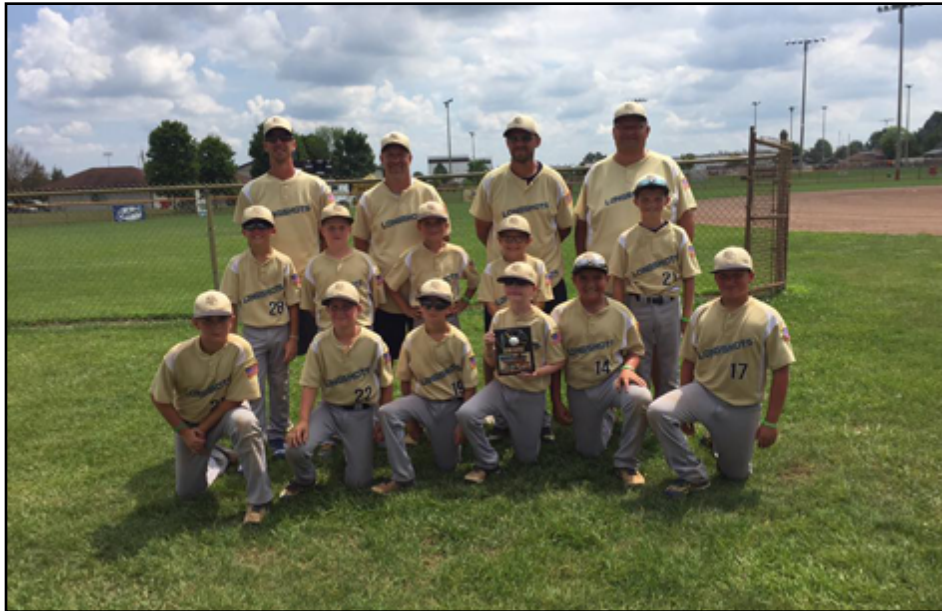

"SON OF A PITCH" WINS HOMETOWN CUP

NEW CARLISLE - Eric Nolan has talked about bringing his Son of a Pitch team (Indianapolis, Ind.) to The Wiffle®Ball Championship at Hometown Days since 2010.

The veteran of the game has to be glad he finally did.

Son of a Pitch (9-0) went undefeated for the weekend, capped by a 7-2 victory over the New Carlisle Newts (8-1) in The Wiffle®Ball Championship Game at Migley Field on Sunday afternoon.

Son of a Pitch cruised to the title after manufacturing five runs in the bottom of the first inning, an essentially insurmountable lead given the conditions at the ballpark.

With the wind blowing in, the confines were not very friend-

ly for offense. Both semifinals featured low scoring games.

Son of a Pitch knocked off the White Lightning (7-1) in the first semifinal, 3-2, in eight innings. The eventual Champions fell behind 2-0 in the first, but were able to push a run across in the second and the bottom of the sixth to force extra innings.

In the second semifinal, an ORW-BL World Series preview, the Maple City Magic (7-1) struck first in the bottom of the fifth. But with the game on the line in the sixth, New Carlisle answered with two, to win 2-1.

The 2016 Championship featured 75 teams from five states, smashing the previous record of 50 teams set just last year. The Hometown Days tournament has continued to grow since its creation in 2005 and has become

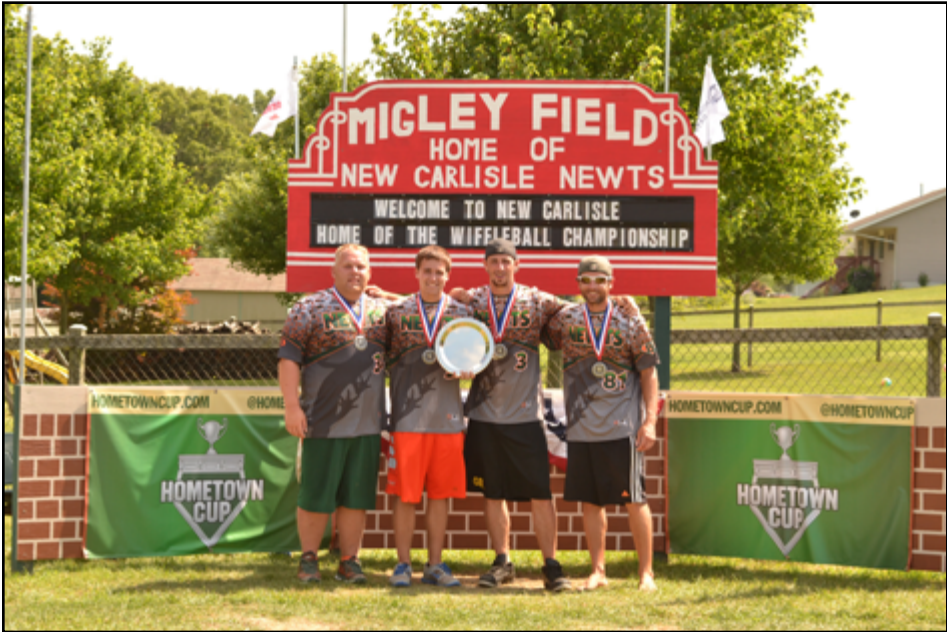

one of the nation's premier events. Nolan's squad, featuring Matt Street, Joseph Horsley, and Tyler Douthitt, took the number one overall seed into Sunday's Hometown Cup Playoffs after an impressive 4-0 showing in pool play with a +93 run differential. To get to Migley, Son of a Pitch won the Bourissa Hills Regional, defeating Watch Yo Face in a lopsided Regional Final, 17-2. Nolan, who pitched through a hamstring injury in the title game, was named the Kaylor Keck Marquee Player of the Hometown Cup Finals.

THE MAJOR LEAGUE: ORWBL

While Son of a Pitch hails from Indianapolis, three of the final four teams are members of the Old Republic Wiffle®Ball League, based in the area. The New Carlisle Newtons made their third consecutive and record fifth overall trip back to their home ballpark. It was their second consecutive loss in the title game.

LaPorte's Maple City Magic made their second straight appearance at Migley, and their fourth in five years. Maple City has yet to break through, losing in the semifinals in each appearance. The White Lightning, who play their home games just outside of New Carlisle, emerged on the scene as a dark horse in 2016. The young and incredibly athletic team is relentless in the field, seemingly flying to every ball hit to them.

STREAK BUSTERS

The three-time defending champions Cult West Warriors (4-1) cruised through pool play on Saturday, extending their record winning streak to 29 games and earning a 1-seed for Sunday's playoffs. However, the bats failed to show up on Sunday morning, as the Warriors were upset by the Jelly Sticks (4-3) by a score of 5-1. Perennial bottom-feeder Phat Dong (1-3) also broke an extended streak, winning their first game in six appearances at The Championship, ending a 21-game skid.
