# HARVEST SEASON: WATCH OUT FOR SLOW-MOVING FARM EQUIPMENT

Harvest season is officially underway, which means more slow-moving farm equipment will be on Indiana's rural roads.

To keep Hoosiers safe this year, state agencies are asking motorists to be alert, patient and responsible, as they share the road with these large vehicles.

"With more than 14 million acres of farmland, this is a busy time of the year for Indiana and our rural roadways," said Lt. Governor Suzanne Crouch, Indiana's Secretary of Agriculture and Rural Development. "We want to encourage every motorist to be aware and exercise caution around farm equipment this season."

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, director.

farm equipment vehicles (not including trucks) were involved in time for your travels is crucial to 92 fatal crashes across the U.S. last year – with six of those incidents occurring in Indiana.

While the term "farm equipment" encompasses a wide range of vehicles, the most common types motorists will encounter include combines, tractors pulling grain carts and large trucks hauling agricultural products.

"Chances are, you'll see farmers on the road before they see you, so it's important to know what to do when approaching these vehicles," said Bruce Kettler, Indiana

The following list includes several safety tips provided by the Indiana Department of Homeland Security.

**Be Alert**

- Watch for wide vehicles, especially when approaching curves and hills in the road.
- Look for a reflective red triangle on the back of any farm equipment on the road. This symbol indicates a slow-moving vehicle.

- cle, one that travels under 25 mph.
- Avoid texting and talking on the phone while driving.

**Be Patient**

- Leaving home 10 minutes early during harvest season can help eliminate any potential delays during the commute.
- Most farmers will pull over when they are able to let you pass, but it may take time for them to get to a safe place to do so.
- Only pass large, slow-moving farm equipment when in an area that allows for passing. Double yellow lines on a roadway indi-

cate an area in which passing is not permitted. Do not attempt to pass when within 100 feet of any intersection, railroad crossing, bridge or tunnel.

**Be Responsible**

- Look for hand signals before attempting to pass the vehicle. The size of farm equipment often dictates the necessity for wide turns, both to the left and the right. Just because a tractor veers right does not mean the operator is pulling over to allow someone to pass.
- Avoid tailgating, as some farm equipment might have to make sudden stops along the road.

The purpose of this is to rid the lines of rust so that it is not as apt to settle in your lines.



This peach recipe will leave you "SPEACHLESS."

## PEACH KUCHEN

### Crust:

1 1/4 cups flour  
1 tsp baking powder  
1 T. sugar  
1/4 pound margarine (1/2 cup)  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1 T. milk

### Filling:

4 - 6 peaches, peeled and halved  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1 cup sour cream  
1 1/2 T. flour  
3/4 cup sugar

### Streusel Topping:

1 1/2 cups sugar

4 T. butter, softened  
4 T. flour  
1 tsp. cinnamon

Crust: Mix flour, baking powder and sugar together. Cut in margarine and mix like a pie crust. Add egg and milk. Press into bottom of a 9 x 12 inch pan.

Filling: Place peaches cut side down on crust. Mix egg, sour cream, flour and sugar; pour over peaches.

Streusel: Cut in butter, sugar and flour together and add cinnamon. Bake 350 degrees F for 45 minutes.

**Etc.** — Kuchen is a filling German dessert, which can be filled with your favorite fruit.

# Don't Get Grounded: Real ID Overview

Beginning Oct. 1, 2020, a Real States citizens (legal temporary or ID-compliant driver's license, permanent residents) are required permit, or identification card will to have a Real ID and must present be required to board commercial full documentation proving identity (name and date of birth), Social airplanes or enter certain federal facilities unless you present a Security number, lawful status in Department of Homeland Security-approved document. the United States, and Indiana residency.

A Real ID meets federal government requirements for driver's licenses, identification cards, and learner's permits.

Do you already have a Real ID? If you have a star in the upper right-hand corner of your driver's license, permit, or identification card, you have a Real-ID compliant license.

To upgrade to Real ID, all customers must visit a BMV branch and bring the required documents. Only original versions or certified copies of the required documents will be accepted.

A Real ID is required for everyone applying for a new Indiana credential (driver's license, learner's permit, or identification card).

Persons who are not United

Customers who are renewing, amending, or replacing their current Indiana credential have the option of applying for a Real ID or a non-compliant credential, but are encouraged to obtain a Real ID-compliant credential.

Whether you are getting a new, renewed, amended, or replaced credential, you will receive your permanent Real ID credential within 14 days of your visit to the license branch, provided there are no problems with your application or documentation.

# Can You Count on a Bountiful Investment "Harvest"?

We're officially in autumn – the season when we bring in what we planted in the spring. But the concept of planting and gathering isn't confined to agriculture.

In fact, it can be used in many walks of life, including investing. So what can you do to help work toward a successful investment "harvest"?

Here is (not quite) a bushel of ideas:

- Plant the right "seeds."** When farmers plant specific crops, they know about what to expect – how long it will take for them to grow, how much yield they'll produce, and so on.

When you invest, you too need to plant "seeds" by choosing investments that are designed to help meet your goals.

For example, to accumulate enough money for a comfortable retirement, you will probably need to own a reasonable percentage of growth-oriented vehicles, such as stocks – you generally can't expect the type of growth you need by investing solely in fixed-income investments, such as bonds and certificates of deposit.

- Nurture your "crops."** Agricultural workers are diligent about cultivating their crops through proper irrigation, fertilization and weed control. And if you want to keep your investment portfolio healthy, you also must find ways to nurture it.

First of all, you will need to

keep adding new dollars regularly, because the larger your overall investment base, the more you can expand its growth potential.

But you might also need to have purchased some investments that, for one reason or another, are now no longer suitable for your needs.

If that's the case, you might be better off by selling these invest-

ments and using the proceeds for new ones that could fill gaps in your portfolio.

- Diversify.** Farmers may plant a mix of crops: corn, soybeans, flax, legumes, fruits, and so on. Consequently, if one crop fails, it won't sink the farmer's entire business.

As an investor, you, too, need to diversify, because if you only own one type of asset class, and a financial downturn hits that asset,

But spreading your dollars among stocks, bonds, cash and other investments can help reduce the impact of market volatility on your holdings. (However, diversification can't guarantee profits or protect against all losses.)

Thus far, we've looked at ideas on how you can create a healthy investment crop. But once it's time to actually start harvesting your portfolio – that is, once you begin liquidating parts of it to support yourself during your retirement years – you also need to act carefully.

Specifically, you need to estab-

lish a withdrawal rate that's appro-

priate for your situation, based on your age, lifestyle, income sources and other factors.

You could be retired for two or three decades, so it's essential you

don't withdraw so much during your early years of retirement that

you risk outliving your money. A
